### FOUNDATION FOR THE FUTURE

Recognizing a need for increased training and education for the industrial finishing industry, the Chemical Coaters Association International established the CCAI Finishing Education Foundation (CCAIFEF) in November 2018. Following receipt of our determination letter from the IRS acknowledging CCAIFEF's status as a 501 (c)(3) tax-exempt charitable organization in June 2019, the next six to nine months were spent getting our ducks in a row – building our Board of Directors, finalizing policies, applying for state charitable solicitation registrations throughout the U.S., and zeroing in on how CCAIFEF could make an impact, even in its infancy.

The backbone of CCAIFEF is its Board of Directors, a small but mighty group of industry veterans with a passion for the education and development of our industry, not only today, but far into the future. How fortunate we have been to have their input and leadership as we worked together to get CCAIFEF off the ground. In addition to determining the best way to build our finances, our Board and staff quickly identified three areas of initial focus – scholarships, Women in Finishing, and the CCAI Finishing Academy. You can read more about these impactful programs in the following pages.

Funding is an ongoing challenge for all charitable organizations, but a significantly higher hurdle for new foundations like ours. So, you may be wondering how CCAIFEF was able to support these initiatives in its infancy. While we anticipate funding to come from a variety of sources as CCAIFEF develops and grows, many of these sources look for financial stability and program impact in the application process – regardless of how long the organization has been in existence. Therefore, the decision was made to begin building our financial foundation through a Founding Member campaign. Founding Members share a commitment to supporting the advancement of industrial finishing and it is with their donations of \$5,000 or greater that CCAIFEF could begin to take action. By the end of 2021, CCAIFEF welcomed eight Founding Members with contributions totaling more than \$70,000. I am eternally grateful to these companies and individuals who see the value in what CCAIFEF strives to accomplish, and their willingness to invest in the early stages of our efforts. I am proud to share with them, and you, the accomplishments we've achieved in 2021 as a direct result of their generosity. Several more companies have committed to joining this elite group of supporters in the coming months and I encourage you to give some thought to becoming a Founding Member, too. The campaign will run through December 31, 2022.

Often the focus is on bringing new talent into the finishing industry - to manufacturing in general. However, it is just as crucial that we retain those who have already chosen a career in finishing and help them grow through ongoing training and development. It is this sentiment that formed the mission of CCAIFEF. It is this mission that I am proud to support and honored to lead through my position as executive director. I cannot overstate the excitement and passion I have for the potential of CCAIFEF and the impact it can, and will, have on the future of industrial finishing. We've hit the ground running, but this is a marathon not a sprint. I hope you will join me in supporting our efforts in any way you can – whether it be financial donations, spreading the word about CCAIFEF to your networks, getting involved with our programs, lending your expertise, or a combination of these valuable contributions. Together, we are building a better finishing industry.

### MATT HEUERTZ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Matt Heuertz Scholarship Program provides funding for students pursuing studies that could lead to a career in industrial finishing. Working with the Chemical Coaters Association International (CCAI), CCAIFEF oversees the administration of the scholarship program and disperses scholarship funds. The program is open to high school seniors as well as technical school and university students that meet requirements set by the Board of Directors. The application period typically opens in early January and closes in early spring. The CCAIFEF Board of Directors reviews qualifying applications and selects scholarship recipients. In 2021 ten scholarship were awarded.

### ELIZABETH TESKA WOMEN IN FINISHING FORUM SCHOLARSHIP

Recruiting and retaining women in our industry is essential if we are to satisfy the ongoing employment challenges we face. Women in Finishing (WiF) offers a variety of resources tailored towards women in the industry, including webinars, networking, and the Women in Finishing FORUM - an outstanding annual two-day professional development conference.

2021 marked the debut of the Elizabeth Teska Women in Finishing (WiF) FORUM Scholarship Program. Named in memory of one of WiF's first members, the program was established by CCAIFEF to give more women in the finishing industry the opportunity to attend the annual two-day conference, benefit from its high-quality professional development sessions, and build their professional networks. Applications are reviewed and recipients selected by the CCAIFEF Board of Directors. The scholarship covers registration fees and accommodations for up to two successful applicants annually.

Applications received in 2021 represented women from suppliers and end users in a variety of roles. The diversity in applicants is reflective of the diversity in FORUM participants. With attendees from the finishing line to executive management, the event fosters a unique learning environment from which all participants benefit.

### **CCAI FINISHING ACADEMY - ONLINE COURSES**

There is an ongoing and expansive need for skilled employees in the world of industrial finishing. The CCAI Finishing Academy aims to provide education and training for those who are new to the industry as well as those who have already chosen a career in finishing. In 2021, the CCAI Finishing Academy launched its first two online training courses: Powder Coating and Liquid Coating. Both 7-week, self-paced courses include weekly assignments, regular quizzes, a final project, and are led by an instructor with extensive industrial finishing experience. The response to the courses, both selling out and generating rave reviews, is indicative of the industry's need for continued education programs delivered in diverse learning formats. CCAIFEF is a proud contributor to the 2021 online course program and plans to continue to support the educational initiatives of the CCAI Finishing Academy in 2022 and beyond.



### POWDER COATING COURSE

This course addresses all aspects of the powder coating process, including formulation, manufacturing of powder coatings, powder coating materials, material handling, surface preparation, powder application equipment and systems, curing technology, quality, maintenance, troubleshooting and overall costs for operating a powder coating line. Each student receives a copy of CCAI's "Powder Coating for Industrial Finishing Applications (Sixth Edition)" training manual.



### LIQUID COATING COURSE

This course addresses all aspects of the liquid coating process including material handling, hanging methods, surface preparation and curing. Students will learn about the benefits and various types of liquid coatings, including formulating and testing. The course also covers the operational costing of a liquid coating system, health and safety, and maintenance and troubleshooting of liquid coating equipment. Each student receives a copy of CCAI's "Liquid Coatings & Equipment for Industrial Finishing Applications" training manual.



### **CHALLENGING TIMES - PROMISING FUTURE**

Today's labor environment is amongst the most challenging in history. Finding and retaining qualified workers is perhaps the largest problem facing business, regardless of industry. With an aging and diminishing workforce, education and training of new employees has never been more important.

It's no secret that United States manufacturing faces extreme workforce shortages. Decades of encouraging youth to pursue university degrees and discouraging technical training have contributed to fewer and fewer youths entering the manufacturing labor pool. By 2020, approximately a quarter of U.S. manufacturing workers were 55 years of age or older. COVID-19 has compounded the phenomenon; the Bureau of Labor Statistics reports that manufacturing job openings have doubled since the start of the pandemic.

The CCAI Finishing Education Foundation (CCAIFEF) plays an important role in helping recruit new workers into manufacturing jobs, retain existing employees, and provide exceptional skills training to meet growing demands. There are a wide variety of education and training initiatives underway throughout industrial finishing. However, adequate funding is key to their implementation and long-term success. As a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, CCAIFEF is uniquely positioned to help provide the resources that build and sustain education and training programs in our industry—whether they be through CCAIFEF, industry associations like the Chemical Coaters Association International, or other qualifying organizations.

Addressing the skilled-employee deficit in our industry is a three-pronged effort:


- Recruitment of new talent,
