GROWTH AND GRATITUDE

Throughout 2022, the CCAI Finishing Education Foundation (CCAI FEF) continued to build upon 2021 programs and initiatives. While the Founding Member campaign provided a cornerstone to establish a financial foundation for CCAI FEF, fundraising is an ongoing component crucial to the success of any 501(c)3 charitable organization. Therefore, new methods of fundraising are underway including the pursuit of grants, automatically renewing financial support for specific programs, and a new fundraising campaign that will appeal to a wide range of donor levels.

Growth over the last year also extended to CCAI FEF's Board of Directors as the organization increased the number of board members from six to seven and welcomed two new directors. MATT HEUERTZ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Matt Heuertz Scholarship Program provides funding for students pursuing studies that could lead to a career in industrial finishing. Working with the Chemical Coaters Association International (CCAI), CCAI FEF oversees the administration of the scholarship program and dispenses scholarship funds. The program is open to high school seniors as well as technical school and university students that meet requirements set by the Board of Directors. The application period typically opens in early January and closes in early spring. The CCAI FEF Board of Directors reviews qualifying applications and selects scholarship recipients. In 2022, nine scholarships were awarded. In addition to monetary awards, scholarship recipients receive a one-year CCAI student membership.

JIM GALLAGHER AWARD

2022 marked the debut of the **Jim Gallagher Award** presented to the most outstanding scholarship applicant. This award was established in honor of long-time CCAI member Jim Gallagher, who served on the National Board of Directors as well as the Wisconsin Chapter Board of Directors for many years. Jim participated on the Education Committee and co-authored and edited countless CCAI technical manuals. The CCAI FEF Board of Directors selected **Daniel Knecht**, University of Cincinnati, to receive the inaugural award.

MEET 2022 JIM GALLAGHER AWARD RECIPIENT DANIEL KNECHT

An environmental engineering major and materials engineering minor at the University of Cincinnati, Daniel's coursework features an emphasis on analytical testing, organic chemistry, material processing, metal corrosion, and electrochemistry. The Dean's list student shares that through his studies he is developing an understanding of the chemistry behind pretreatment.

A co-op at Calvary Industries, where he worked on projects such as running multi-stage pretreatment processes on a variety of substrates and developing test methods to determine the percentage of chemistry in a customer's treatment line, introduced Daniel to the practical applications of his studies. Daniel shares his experience at Calvary, "opened my mind to a new career choice where I can grow professionally and create new and improved chemistries."



Outside of the lab and classroom, Daniel volunteers at a local homeless shelter and worked as a water sampler of one of the largest tributaries into the Ohio River. The combination of Daniel's studies, finishing-related work experience, and contributions to his community made him the perfect inaugural Jim Gallagher Award recipient.

ELIZABETH TESKA WOMEN IN FINISHING FORUM SCHOLARSHIP

Recruiting and retaining women in our industry is essential if we are to satisfy ongoing employment challenges. Women in Finishing (WiF) offers professional development and networking tailored towards women in the industry. WiF's signature program, the WiF FORUM, is an outstanding annual two-day conference that offers professional development sessions, presentations on industry trends and technologies, team building, and networking.

The Elizabeth Teska Women in Finishing FORUM Scholarship Program, named in memory of one of WiF's first members, was established by CCAI FEF to give more women in the finishing industry the opportunity to attend this conference, benefit from its high-quality professional development sessions, and build their professional networks. Applications are reviewed and recipients selected by the CCAI FEF Board of Directors. The scholarship covers registration fees and accommodations for up to two successful applicants annually.

Applications received in 2022 represented women from suppliers and end users in a variety of roles. The diversity in applicants is reflective of the diversity in FORUM participants. With attendees from the finishing line to executive management, the event fosters a unique learning environment from which all participants benefit.

CCAI FINISHING ACADEMY - ONLINE COURSES

The CCAI Finishing Academy launched its online course program in 2021 featuring 7-week, self-paced courses, one focused on powder coating and another on liquid coating. The courses are led by instructors with extensive industrial finishing experience and include weekly assignments, regular quizzes, and a final project. In 2022, each of the popular online courses was held three times. A total of 90 students benefitted from the in-depth material designed to provide professional development in a flexible and efficient format.



POWDER COATING COURSE

This course addresses all aspects of the powder coating process, including formulation, manufacturing of powder coatings, powder coating materials, material handling, surface preparation, powder application equipment and systems, curing technology, quality, maintenance, troubleshooting and overall costs for operating a powder coating line. Each student receives a copy of CCAI's "Powder Coating for Industrial Finishing Applications (Sixth Edition)" training manual.

Student Comments:

- The amount of information in the book and course is great and very detailed.
- Learned a lot about different powders and ways to be a better powder coater.
- Not one thing that I did not like. Very good training and education.



LIQUID COATING COURSE

This course addresses all aspects of the liquid coating process including material handling, hanging methods, surface preparation, application and curing. Students learn about the benefits and various types of liquid coatings, including formulating and testing. The course also covers the operational costing of a liquid coating system, health and safety, and maintenance and troubleshooting of liquid coating equipment. Each student receives a copy of CCAI's "Liquid Coatings & Equipment for Industrial Finishing Applications" training manual.

Student Comments:

- I liked that it was completely at my own pace. My schedule can vary from week to week, so the flexibility was nice.
- I liked learning about the different types of spray equipment, booths, and ovens.
- The final exam being a mockup of a real-life scenario was a nice ending.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



SUCCESS IN THE FACE OF ADVERSITY

2022 was a challenging year with low unemployment and high inflation causing many to consider new opportunities. A recent PwC survey found that over a quarter of workers plan to change jobs within the next year. This figure is even more severe when looking at the younger generations with 35% of Generation Z and 31% of millennials workers considering a move.

Younger employees searching for new opportunities is compounded with the high number of 55+ employees in our industry, many looking at retirement; as highlighted in last year's letter from our past-President, Sam Woehler. The scholarship opportunities offer a way for both high school and college students to find out more about our great industry. Companies can further this via Co-Op and internship opportunities. We have efforts to reach out to underrepresented members of our industry, such as the Elizabeth Teska Women in Finishing FORUM scholarship program which enables more women to attend the very successful WiF FORUM. We are also supporting the development and launch of an in-person finishing curriculum and lab for those interested in joining our industry or existing employees interested in increasing their skillset.

These efforts require funding, from development of the coursework to the yearly scholarship funds. CCAI FEF is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization; allowing us to be positioned to execute on the prior mentioned activities as well as consistently striving to push for new ways to impact our industry.

As the current CCAI FEF President, I am proud of our excellent Board of Directors and staff who are dedicated to serve the industry in these efforts. Even in the face of adversity, I'm confident that through their efforts, we will be successful in our over-arching goal to increase the population of skilled employees within our industry.
