A Message from the Executive Director

Building Momentum for the Future of Finishing

2025 marked an important year of momentum for the Chemical Coaters Association International Finishing Education Foundation (CCAI FEF)—one that demonstrated both the growing reach of our programs and the expanding community committed to supporting them. Across every initiative, we saw greater engagement, stronger partnerships, and meaningful investment in our mission as we strengthen the future of the finishing industry through education and career awareness.

One of the most significant achievements this year was the continued diversification of our funding. In 2025, the number of unique donors to CCAI FEF doubled compared with 2024, reflecting growing confidence in both our mission and our ability to deliver meaningful impact. This support came not only from companies and individuals within the finishing industry, but increasingly from community and family foundations outside our industry that recognize the value of education and career exploration for the next generation.

This growing investment directly supports programs that create lasting opportunities for students and professionals. We were especially grateful to receive additional grant support from the PPG Foundation at the end of 2025 to help fund our 2026 Summer Industrial Finishing Camp program, further strengthening one of our most impactful initiatives. The camp program continues to demonstrate what is possible when industry, educators, and philanthropic partners come together around a common purpose. In 2025, we doubled the number of camps from our inaugural year in 2023, expanding from four camps to eight.

As the camp program expands, we continue to explore innovative ways to enrich the camper experience. Because many camp hosts do not have access to finishing equipment for hands-on instruction, virtual reality has become an exciting tool to help bridge that gap. In 2025, CCAI FEF donated three SprayVerse VR finishing and sandblasting app licenses to the State College of Florida as a pilot program, and the results exceeded expectations. Campers quickly discovered that finishing is far more than “spray and walk away,” using visual assessment tools to understand where coating was applied too thin, too thick, or just right. The overwhelmingly positive response has made equipping all finishing camp hosts with virtual reality finishing a key goal for 2026.

Another meaningful milestone in 2025 was the debut of the Bob Warren Award under the Matt Heuertz Scholarship Program. This award recognizes a high-scoring scholarship applicant with hands-on coating experience and strong potential for a career in the industry. It has been especially meaningful to work alongside Bob, a longtime leader within CCAI and CCAI FEF, and one of our most generous founding members, to select a recipient who reflects his vision for this award.

The progress we made in 2025 would not be possible without the generosity of our donors, the leadership of our Board of Directors, and the dedication of our volunteers and partners. As we look ahead, we remain focused on expanding access, increasing awareness, and building the workforce our industry needs. Thank you for investing in this mission and helping create opportunities that will strengthen the finishing industry for generations to come.

Summer Finishing Camps Continue to Grow

The CCAI FEF Industrial Finishing Camp Program celebrated another year of impressive growth in 2025. A total of eight camps were held across the country, introducing 74 students to the world of industrial finishing. Since the program's debut in 2023, 200 students have attended camp, each gaining hands-on experience and insight into potential finishing careers. Two new schools joined the program in 2025: Ivy Tech Community College in Evansville, IN, and McHenry County College in Crystal Lake, IL. Both quickly became shining examples of the collaboration between education and industry that defines the finishing camp experience.

Ivy Tech's camp received strong support from the finishing community, including a grant to CCAI FEF from Koch Finishing Systems earmarked for Ivy's camp operations. Koch also hosted campers for a tour and led the pretreatment portion of the curriculum. Nix Industrial provided additional industry exposure, welcoming campers to explore their recent plant expansion and try their hand at powder coating. The company also generously provided transportation services.

McHenry County College's inaugural camp was supported by the CCAI Northern Illinois Chapter, including assistance in coordinating a tour of Mitsubishi Logisnext. BASF|Chemetall led the pretreatment section of the program and All-Color Powder Coating's Dan Anderson traveled from Wisconsin to provide an interactive experience with their virtual reality powder coating system.

Camps across the country reported deeper partnerships and expanded programming. Several long-time industry partners returned for a third consecutive year, including ACME Finishing, Taylor Corporation, True Grit Powder Coating, and S&B Metal Products. S&B expanded its participation in 2025 to a full-day event, where campers fabricated their own cell phone holders, then powder coated and took them home, providing a complete fab to finish experience.

At DeWys Manufacturing, the camp experience grew to include tours of the Kent Career Tech Center, Western Michigan University, and the PPG powder plant in Grand Haven, broadening campers' view of the finishing industry's career pathways. After a successful session in 2024, BASF|Chemetall returned to lead campers through the pretreatment lesson.

The Madison Area Technical College (MATC) Fort Atkinson camp also took a leap forward, expanding its collaboration with All-Color Powder Coating to include a full day at the facility. Campers toured the plant, explored the VR system, and even powder coated their own sheet metal Jeep, a memorable highlight that capped off an incredible learning experience.

Virtual reality played an even greater role this year, helping campers build confidence before entering the shop. Using the SprayVerse VR finishing program, State College of Florida (SCF) campers were able to hone their finishing skills using the app's integrated assessment tools. "At first, the kids were getting Fs," the camp director shared. "With practice, they improved to Bs and Cs, and it showed when they got to powder coat their own cell phone holders at S&B Metal Products later in the week."

The program's color-focused component also grew in 2025, with three companies—IFS Coatings, Avient Corporation, and the Pittsburgh Paints Company—supporting multiple camp locations. Their involvement introduced students to color trends and theory and how they influence selection of the color of the year.



Matt Heuertz Scholarship Program

The Matt Heuertz Scholarship Program provides funding for students pursuing studies that could lead to a career in industrial finishing and coatings. The program is open to high school seniors, and technical college and university students that meet requirements set by the Board of Directors. The CCAI FEF Board of Directors reviews qualifying applications and selects scholarship recipients. In 2025, 11 scholarships totaling \$17,500 were awarded. In addition to monetary awards, scholarship recipients receive one-year CCAI student memberships.

The program includes two special awards. The Jim Gallagher Scholarship is a \$5,000 award granted to the highest scoring applicant. The Bob Warren Scholarship, supported by Sames, debuted in 2025. This \$2,500 award is given to an applicant that demonstrates significant hands-on finishing experience and a strong desire for a career in finishing.

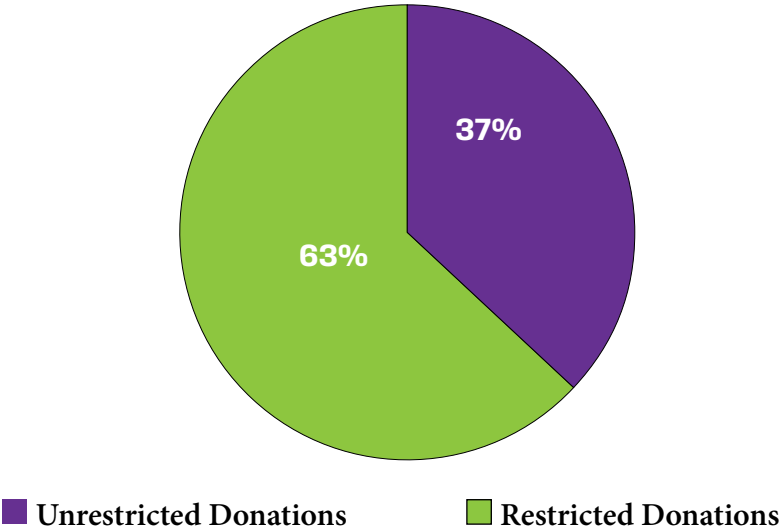

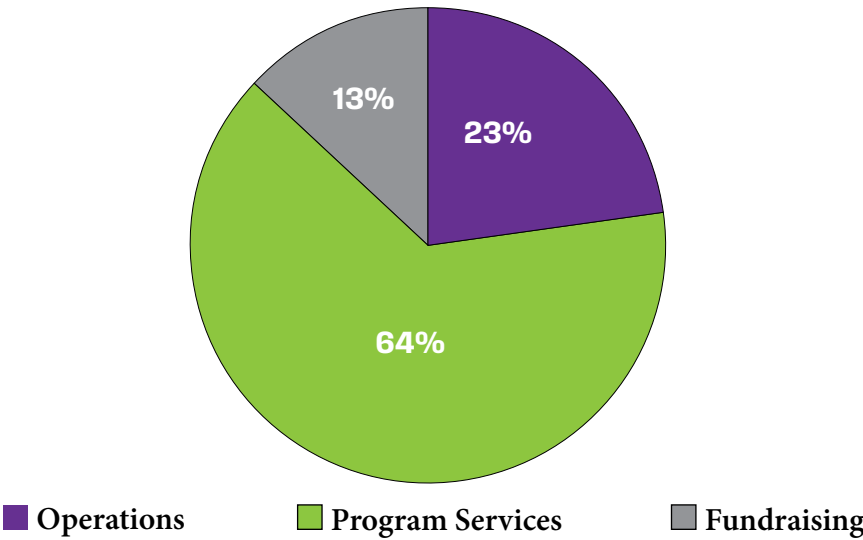
