FINISHING LAB DEVELOPMENT

To meet the demand for trained finishing employees, the 6-module in-person curriculum includes both book work and hands-on learning. In order to successfully implement the program, a finishing lab is required to ready students for real world application. A fully functioning lab would include pretreat equipment, paint booth, application equipment, cure oven, etc. Donations to the Finishing Lab Development Program are used specifically to create a new or enhance an existing finishing lab. Both equipment and monetary donations are encouraged and accepted for this program.



Women in Finishing (WiF) provides personal and professional development for women who have chosen or are pursuing a career in industrial finishing. From the finishing line to executive management, WiF programs assist in the advancement of women in the finishing industry.

WEBINAR SERIES: Designed to address relevant topics that impact both the personal and professional lives of WiF members, the webinar series provides a convenient avenue for education and development that can be shared by all women in an organization.

WIF FORUM: WiF's signature event, the annual FORUM, is a two-day, in-person conference that provides participants with new ways to deal with issues that impact effectiveness, maximize professional impact, build strategies for success, and much more. Finishing technology and trends are also a highlight of the conference and are addressed by expert presenters and shop tours.

NETWORKING EVENTS: WiF hosts a number of networking events throughout the year, enabling members to connect in a relaxed, social atmosphere. WiF receptions are held at FABTECH and the CCAI Annual Meeting.

Donations to WiF are used to support program development and implementation. In addition, WiF funds are used to provide scholarships to enable women to attend the annual FORUM at a reduced rate.





SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

CCAI National and Chapter scholarship programs attract bright new talent to the industrial finishing and surface coating technologies industry. Over the past five years, more than \$125,000 in scholarships have been awarded to students enrolled in programs that could lead to a career in the finishing industry. Donations to the National and Chapter programs are allocated to the donor's identified program of choice with 100% of the donation going directly to students.
